COURSE OVERVIEW

The CHC50325 Diploma of Child, Youth and Family Intervention equips you with the skills to support children, young people, and families at risk. You'll develop strong communication and case management strategies, learn to respond appropriately to diverse and complex needs, and build the professional skills required to work effectively within this rewarding sector. This course is ideal for those looking to start a career supporting vulnerable individuals, as well as for those seeking to formalise their qualifications or progress in their existing role.

With the community services sector identified as one of the fastest-growing industries in Australia, and this area recognised as a skills shortage by the Queensland Government, the demand for qualified workers continues to rise. The sector plays a vital role in supporting individuals, families, and communities, improving wellbeing and quality of life through social, residential, family, and disability support.
