COURSE DETAILS

Flexible Intake: Start at any time

Prerequisites: There are no formal entry requirements

Duration: 5 to 6 months

Theory: 15 units in total (9 Core units and 6 Elective units)

Delivery: Face to Face: Class runs every Thursday and Friday (9am to 3pm)

Online: Course can be completed in your own time with ongoing support from your Trainer/Assessor. Only students *currently employed* in the industry at an approved

facility are eligible to study online.

Assessments: Written assessments and practical assessments, no essays or exams

Practical: 120 hours of Vocational Placement required

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Basic English, Literacy, Numeracy and computer skills are required to undertake computer/online work. Students will also require access to a computer and internet. A Police Clearance will be required prior to commencing vocational placement (after completion of units) and must be dated within six months of the placement start date. In some cases, a Vaccination Certificate may also be required. Please note that manual handling tasks will be involved.
